Director's Report

Matt Stout, Chief of Staff, Office of National Marine Sanctuaries

- See read ahead program updates **HERE**.
- The FY23 President's Request came out earlier this spring and ONMS continues to maintain a strong request level.
 - The President's Request included \$86.7M in Operations, Research, and Facilities (ORF) (a \$25.7M increase from FY22 Enacted) and \$4M in Procurement, Acquisition, and Construction (PAC) (\$1M decrease from FY22 and back to the FY21 appropriated level) for ONMS.
 - This is the second year in a row that the President has asked Congress to provide a fairly large increase to the ONMS budget.
 - The House also recently released their proposed FY23 budget. The draft bill recommends \$68M in ORF (a \$7M increase from FY22 Enacted) and \$10M in PAC (\$5M increase from FY22 Enacted) for ONMS.
 - The Senate is still negotiating, but we're hoping to hear the details of their proposed budget in the next few months.
- Build back better fund included 50 million dollars for ONMS facilities and construction. The Inflation Reduction Act included 50 million dollars for ONMS facilities.

Questions/comments:

- Taishya Adams requested a review of the ONMS portfolio of recreation activities and facilities during the fall/winter 2022 meeting.
- Taishya requested ONMS to reshare public comment opportunities for Florida Keys National Marine Sanctuary Restoration Blueprint and intent to designate Hudson Canyon National Marine Sanctuary. See information on both opportunities below.

Action Item: Proposed Charter Amendment

- 3. The amendment will be posted to the ONMS BAC website and Katie will announce the nomination period for co-chairs.
- 4. During the next public BAC meeting, we will hold officer elections.

 - Taishya requested that additional time be provided during the next meeting to ensure the group has enough time for discussion and questions.

A. Office of National Marine Sanctuaries Program Updates





- March 2022: ONMS released annual site accomplishment reports for FY21 (see <u>HERE</u>). These reports highlight notable events, programs, and achievements that took place in each national marine sanctuary and Papahānaumokuākea Marine National Monument.
- April 2022: New Sanctuary <u>Soundscape</u> Monitoring Project <u>portal</u> released. The portal will allow the public to learn about and listen to underwater sounds in National Marine Sanctuaries.

June 2022 (Ocean Month):

- NOAA participated in Capitol Hill Oceans Week or CHOW. This is a two day event that brings together people from all over to talk about ocean conservation. The theme of CHOW this year was Sea: the Future. It celebrated the 50 years of progress achieved and to set a course for the new policies and actions necessary to transform our future. Presentations from the event can be found HERE.
- NOAA announced the initiation of a scoping process to seek public comment on the potential national marine sanctuary designation in the <u>Hudson Canyon</u> area approximately 100 miles offshore of New York and New Jersey. The public comment period is open until August 8.
- NOAA announced the adding of Alaĝum Kanuux: Heart Of The Ocean to the inventory of successful sanctuary nominations. The nominated area supports globally significant populations of marine mammals, seabirds, and fish, as well as ecological and cultural keystone species such as northern fur seals and Steller sea lions which are also vital for the subsistence of the Unangan (Aleut) people and are integral to their belief systems and identities.

July 2022:

- NOAA released a Notice of Proposed Rulemaking (referred to as the "proposed rule") and draft revised management plan (together known as the "Restoration Blueprint") for updates to the boundary, marine zones, regulations, and management activities within Florida Keys National Marine Sanctuary. NOAA is accepting public comments through October 26.
- NOAA selected seven female graduate students as recipients of the <u>Dr. Nancy Foster Scholarship</u>. The scholarship recognizes





- outstanding graduate students and encourages independent research in the areas of marine biology, oceanography, and maritime archaeology, particularly by female and minority students.
- On July 21, 2022 the Biden-Harris Administration held an event at the White House to officially launch an interagency effort, called the <u>Federal Interagency Council on Outdoor Recreation (FICOR)</u>, that will work to create more safe, affordable, and equitable opportunities for Americans to get outdoors. Participants included Business Advisory Council members Jessica Turner, Taldi Harrison, Maite Arce and ONMS staff member Grace Bottita-Williamson. NOAA is participating on the Council and will be coordinating with the Business Advisory Council.
- Join our summer-long celebration of 50 Years of Ocean Conservation and Stewardship through a <u>variety of in-person and on-line activities</u>, aptly named "Get into Your Sanctuary," across the National Marine Sanctuary System. We invite you to also consider amplifying our social media posts, photos and other resources to craft celebratory messages to share with your audiences.
